No luxury car built offers a wider or more attractive selection of options and accessories than Cadillac. In addition to all its standard equipment, Cadillac caters still further to your individual needs and desires with an array of special conveniences to make each Cadillac the most personalized car possible.

1 Automatic climate control maintains a preselected temperature as automatically and easily as you set your home thermostat. The system can be bypassed by a new vent position for filtered outside air.

2 Cruise Control permits setting and maintaining a desired speed without using the accelerator pedal. It also acts as a speed reminder by a gentle back pressure to the accelerator when selected speed is reached.

3 All doors can be locked or unlocked from either front door, a feature especially appreciated by Cadillac families.

4 Twilight Sentinel turns lights on and off automatically according to light conditions and can be set as you leave the car to keep lights on up to ninety seconds for a path of light at night.

5 Tilt and Telescope steering wheel adjusts in four directions for personal comfort and swings up for easier entry and exit.

6 A padded vinyl roof enhances the beauty of Cadillac styling. It is standard in five colors on the Brougham and available on De Ville closed models, the Seventy-Five series and the Eldorado.

7 The Cadillac AM Radio has superb tone with wide bass or treble adjustment. Sound may be directed through front or rear

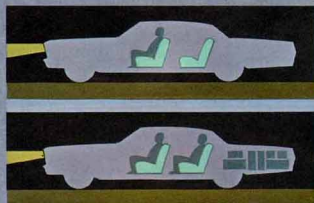
speaker or both. Tuning is manual by pushbutton or automatic with signal bar selector.

8 AM-FM Radio adds the enjoyment of fine FM and features two speakers, automatic frequency control and an automatic antenna which is standard with all Cadillac radios.

9 The Cadillac AM-FM Stereo Radio brings you the full richness of stereo FM. Two speakers in front and two in the rear are cross-balanced—left front with right rear and right front with left rear for true stereo sound for driver and passengers.

10 Adjustable front seat headrests are available for both conventional bench type seat, above, and bucket seats, below.

11 Six-way power seat control gives horizontal, vertical and angle adjustment for maximum comfort.

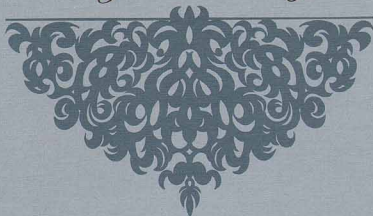
12 Automatic level control, standard on Fleetwood models and available on De Ville and Calais models, keeps the car level, even when fully loaded. Appearance, handling and headlamp aim are maintained and "bottoming" is reduced on bumps, steep ramps and driveways.

13 When bucket seats are chosen, you may also select a reclining right front seat with adjustable headrest. The reclining seat is also available on the Eldorado with

bench seat. Additional popular accessories not shown include: electrically heated front seat warmer (rear seat on Seventy-Five models); Guide-Matic power headlamp dimmer; remote control trunk lock; Controlled Differential for more positive traction on slippery roads; rear window de-fogger; Soft Ray glass; door edge guards and white sidewall tires. 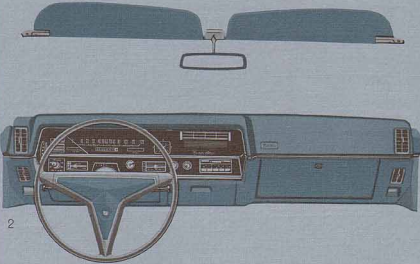
As Always, Cadillac Is Unexcelled in Motoring Safety Features

For years, Cadillac's advanced engineering has provided a constantly increasing number of motoring safety and convenience features—in addition to the car's inherent quality, stability, quietness and handling ease. For 1967, the list is even more impressive than ever before.



1. New energy absorbing steering column, developed by General Motors, is designed to compress on impact and is standard with the regular or optional Tilt and Telescope steering wheels. Both wheels have a large padded load-distributing center.

2. The redesigned instrument panel is heavily padded and also reduces glare. Knobs are of minimum length with flat surfaces. Sun visors are softly padded.

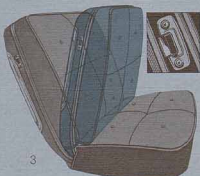


3. Folding front coupe seats or bucket seats automatically latch firmly in place, and can be released by individual manual pushbutton controls.

4. The hazard warning system, activated by a control on the right side of the steering column, flashes front directional lamps and rear stop lamps to warn oncoming drivers when you are moving slowly or stopped at the roadside.

And, of course, there are many other safety and convenience features. For example, a triple braking system keeps front or rear brakes individually operative if one pair should fail. A red teardrop light warns of malfunction of either system. Brakes are self-adjusting each time the car is reversed. In addition, the foot-operated parking brake operates separately as a true emergency brake and releases itself when the car is in drive position with the engine running.

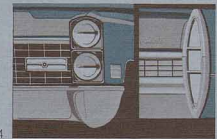
Front and rear seat belts, retractable on the outboard side, are standard. Anchors are provided for center seat belts. Closed models have anchors on the outboard side for optional front shoulder straps. Wise motorists teach children to always use



their seat belts and insist that adult passengers do so, too.

Windshield wiper-washers are adjustable to three speeds, and arms are glare-reducing.

The direction signal has been redesigned with a special position for easier lane-change signaling. The other position is for cornering. Indicators are on the top of the fenders for ready visibility.



Manual window and vent handles, shift lever and turn signal lever have soft large diameter knobs. Front and rear door handles are inoperative when passenger-guard door lock buttons are depressed.

Cadillac safety engineers are constantly striving to keep Cadillac motoring the most reassuring in the world. You can help them—and yourself—by driving courteously, keeping alert and obeying all traffic regulations.

WINDSHIELD WASHER AND WIPERS, three-speed with glare-reducing wiper arms

WINDOW REGULATORS, power-operated (optional on Calais)

ENGINE: Eight-cylinder, 340 HP, overhead, 90° V-type; bore 4.13", stroke 4.0"; displacement 429 cu. in. Max. torque 480 ft.-lbs. Engine mounted in rubber at three points. Compression ratio 10.5 to 1.

PISTONS: Aluminum alloy, slipper type to reduce friction surfaces and permit nesting between crankshaft counterweights. New top compression ring inverted to pump oil upwards rather than down, one wide oil ring with expander; top compression ring molybdenum-filled to minimize wear on cylinder walls. Contoured piston head increases turbulence for fast, complete burning of fuel-air mixture.

CARBURETOR: New Quadrajel four-barrel downdraft with equalized manifold; mechanical fuel pump; dry type air filter; new automatic choke.

LUBRICATION: Full pressure, Full-flow oil filter standard.

ELECTRICAL SYSTEM: 12-volt, 13-plate battery. High capacity 42 amp. generator (65 amp. air conditioned cars).



GASOLINE TANK CAPACITY: Approximately 26 gallons; Eldorado approximately 24.

TURBO HYDRAMATIC: Fully automatic, improved torque converter type with variable stator (except Seventy-Five models). Converter multiplies engine torque for increased driving thrust to drive wheels during acceleration in any gear (low, intermediate or high).

REAR AXLE: Hypoid. Differential housing offset to provide straight-line drive. Ratio is 2.94 with a 3.21 axle available (3.21 only on Eldorado). The 3.21 axle is standard on all air-conditioned models and the Seventy-Five models. Available (except Eldorado) is the controlled differential which directs power to rear wheel having better traction.

FRONT SUSPENSION: Spherical joint with Cadillac Independent, helical-coil-type springs. Rubber mounted strut rods and rubber bushings absorb impacts and isolate road noise. (Torsion bar suspension on Eldorado.)

REAR SUSPENSION: Four-link drive. Rear springs are helical-coil-type. Rubber bushings for quieter, softer ride. (Single leaf

springs with two horizontal and two vertical shock absorbers on Eldorado.)

BRAKES: Cadillac power brakes with self-adjusting shoes; finned front and composite finned rear drums. Split hydraulic master cylinder provides independent piston and fluid reservoir for front and rear brakes. (Front disc brakes available on Eldorado.)

PARKING BRAKE: Locks as true auxiliary brake . . . will not lock in position with engine running and car in gear . . . can be operated as a foot emergency brake while car is in motion. Automatically releases when transmission is in any drive range with engine running.

STEERING: Cadillac variable ratio power steering is standard equipment (except Seventy-Five models). Energy absorbing steering column. Overall steering ratio of 16.2 to 1 (except 18.2 on Seventy-Five models and 15.3 on Eldorado) and 361° turning angle provides fast response and short turning diameter.

FRAME: Perimeter frame is fully boxed in its entire length with hidden bulkheads for additional torsional rigidity. Eldorado has a frame especially designed for its front wheel drive and front and rear suspension.

TIRES: Low pressure, 2-ply tubeless, size 9.00 x 15 on all models except the Fleetwood Seventy-Five on which the size is 8.20 x 15, 4-ply. Black sidewalls are standard on all models. White sidewalls may be selected on all models.

CORNERING LIGHTS: (standard equipment) On the side of front fenders, actuated by directional signal lever when headlamp switch is on. Project a beam of light from the side of the car, thus illuminating roadside for extra convenience at night.

READ: 60 2/3" (Eldorado 63 5/8", front; 63", rear.)

WHEELBASE: 129.5" (Fleetwood Sixty Special Sedan and Brougham, 133"; Fleetwood Seventy-Five, 149.75"; Eldorado, 120")

OVERALL LENGTH: 224" (Fleetwood Sixty Special Sedan and Brougham, 221.5"; Fleetwood Seventy-Five, 244.5"; Eldorado, 221")

ADDITIONAL COLORS not shown on cars illustrated include: Grecian White, Regal Silver, Summit Gray, Marina Blue, Admiralty Blue, Sherwood Green, Regent Maroon, and, as options, Olympic Bronze Firemist, Crystal Firemist and Ember Firemist.

NOTE: Where leather is used in the De Ville and Fleetwood cars, richly textured vinyl is provided in heavy wear areas.

SPECIFICATIONS

Engine: Eight-cylinder, 340 HP, overhead, 90° V-type; bore 4.13", stroke 4.0"; displacement 429 cu. in. Max. torque 460 ft.-lbs. Engine mounted in rubber at three points. Compression ratio 10.5 to 1.

Pistons: Aluminum alloy, slipper type to reduce friction surfaces and permit nesting between crankshaft counterweights. New top compression ring inverted to pump oil upwards rather than down, one wide oil ring with expander; top compression ring molybdenum-filled to minimize wear on cylinder walls. Contoured piston head increases turbulence for fast, complete burning of fuel-air mixture.

Carburetor: New Quadrajets four-barrel downdraft with equalized manifold; mechanical fuel pump; dry type air filter; new automatic choke.

Lubrication: Full pressure. Full-flow oil filter standard.

Electrical System: 12-volt, 13-plate battery. High capacity 42 amp. generator (55 amp., air conditioned cars).

Gasoline Tank Capacity: Approximately 26 gallons; Eldorado, approximately 24.

Turbo Hydra-Matic: Fully automatic, improved torque converter type with variable stator (except Seventy-Five). Converter multiplies engine torque for increased driving thrust to drive wheels during acceleration in any gear (low, intermediate or high).

Rear Axle: Hypoid. Differential housing offset to provide straight-line drive. Ratio is 2.94 with a 3.21 axle available (3.21 only on Eldorado). The 3.21 axle is standard on all air-conditioned models and the Seventy-Five models. Available (except Eldorado)

is the controlled differential, which directs power to rear wheel having better traction.

Front Suspension: Spherical joint with Cadillac independent, helical-coil-type springs. Rubber mounted strut rods and rubber bushings absorb impacts and isolate road noise. (Torsion bar suspension on Eldorado.)

Rear Suspension: Four-link drive. Rear springs are helical-coil-type. Rubber bushings for quieter, softer ride. (Single leaf springs with two horizontal and two vertical shock absorbers on Eldorado.)

Brakes: Cadillac power brakes with self-adjusting shoes; finned front and composite finned rear drums. Split hydraulic master cylinder provides independent piston and fluid reservoir for front and rear brakes. (Front disc brakes available on Eldorado.)

Parking Brake: Serves as true auxiliary brake . . . will not lock in position with engine running and car in gear . . . can be operated as a foot emergency brake while car is in motion. Automatically releases when transmission is in any drive range with engine running.

Steering: Cadillac variable ratio power steering is standard equipment (except on Seventy-Five). Energy absorbing steering column. Overall steering ratio of 16.7 to 1 (except 18.2 on Seventy-Five models and 16.3 on Eldorado) and 38½" turning angle provide fast response and short turning diameter.

Frame: The entire length of the perimeter frame is fully boxed in, with hidden bulkheads for additional torsional rigidity. Eldorado has a frame especially designed for

its front wheel drive and front and rear suspension systems.

Tires: Low pressure, 2-ply tubeless, size 9.00x 15 on all models except the Fleetwood Seventy-Five on which the size is 8.20 x 15, 4-ply. Black sidewalls are standard on all models. White sidewalls may be selected on all models.

Cornering Lights: (standard equipment) On the side of front fenders, activated by directional signal lever when headlamp switch is on. Project a beam of light from the side of the car, thus illuminating roadside for extra convenience at night.

Tread: 62.5". (Eldorado 63.5", front; 63", rear.)

Wheelbase: Fleetwood Sixty Special Sedan and Brougham, 133"; Fleetwood Seventy-Five, 149.75"; Eldorado, 120".

Overall Length: Fleetwood Sixty Special Sedan and Brougham, 227.5"; Fleetwood Seventy-Five, 244.5"; Eldorado, 221".
